

Be it remembered that on the 6th day of August 1808 William Henry late Sheriff and late Parish Judge presented a deed to be recorded, which I proceeded to record as follows (viz)

Whereas I William Henry late Sheriff of the County and late Judge of the interior Parish of Lafourche by virtue of the power vested in me as late Sheriff & late Parish Judge by an act entitled, an act for levying a tax on lands and Slaves in the Territory of Orleans passed the tenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and seven did seize a tract of land belonging to Gaspar Falcon & advertised the same according to law and having exposed the same at public auction Mr. Thomas Kennedy became the purchaser of said tract of land about three miles from the Mississippi River bounded above by claim, and below by claim on about three acres front with the ordinary

depth of forty acres for the sum of twelve dollars last

that I the said Lito Shuff do in consideration of the
